WELCOME BACK

Dear Parents

On behalf of the Parents and Friends Association ("PFA") I would like to welcome you back to 2019 and we look forward to providing a range of activities for families to become involved in throughout the year in support of the College.

All Parents who pay the \$5 PFA levy as part of the school fees are members of the PFA. Meetings are held at least once a term and an AGM is held in Term 4.

Throughout the year the PFA run community, service and fundraising events. In recent years the PFA have helped fund the Junior School toilets, the Media and Film program, landscaping

around the new Senior School building, Family Picnics and various Food Days each term.

VOLUNTEERING

Parents are reminded that if you are volunteering at school, you'll need a current Working With Children Check. These can be done <u>online</u> and then submitted at a post office at no cost.

The school also requires parents who volunteer or go on excursions to read and sign a Child Safety Code of Conduct form, which is available from the school office.

PARENT PARTICIPATION HOURS

Families can participate by being involved in a variety of activities. During the year, notices will be sent out requesting parent help at various events or activities, for example, helping at sports carnivals, covering library books, icy pole Fridays, 2nd Hand Uniform Shop, PFA events, classroom help or attending working bees.

Parents are required to record the hours they have completed in the Parent Hours Book which is kept in the College Office. You will be charged a Parent Participation fee of \$250 at the commencement of each year and will be credited at the end of the term for any work done. You will be credited at a rate of \$25 per hour of work completed, up to a maximum of \$250 for the year. The time requirement for each family is ten hours per year.

Keep an eye out for notices in the Week at a Glance for activities and events being held each Term.

School Banking will take place on each Tuesday of the School Term.

The Uniform Shop is located just next to the Multi-Purpose Hall and student drop off area.

STUDENT SHOEBOX FOR CAMBODIA





"The 2018 Mission Discovery trip was an incredible and unforgettable experience which has impacted us all, not only in our knowledge and understanding, but spiritually as well.

Although it is considered a developing country, Cambodia is filled with extravagant, historic

temples, tight and cramped marketplaces and many small villages with a strong sense of community. One thing that we noticed straight away, was that many locals, especially the children, would often smile and wave at us even though we were complete strangers to them.

Although it is a beautiful country, Cambodia is still recovering from a civil war where millions of citizens, separated from their families, were forced into makeshift prison cells made from old classrooms. There they were tortured mercilessly before many were killed. It was a dark time in their nation's history but together they have become a stronger nation.

Samaritan's Purse has been supporting their recovery and development and we had the opportunity, during the Discovery Trip, to experience and participate in some of the projects through which Cambodian Christians were helping to improve the lives of their fellow Cambodians. The money that we have raised from fundraisers here at St Andrews is sent to Samaritans Purse where they use it for projects such as the Hope Project that was designed to provide a sustainable source of clean water through water tanks for villages or bio-sand filters (BSF) for families. We even had the opportunity of installing a few filters before sharing lunch with a village family.

Food security is also low in rural areas of Cambodia, especially for developing infants, and over 40% of their children in some areas are malnourished. SP created a recipe called 'borbor' or a type of rice porridge that contains easily accessible ingredients such as egg yolks, green vegetables and fish that provide all the required nutrients in order for the children's bodies to grow.

However, the most memorable highlight for all of us was experiencing the sense of joy from the school children as we handed out the shoeboxes to them. (On this note, I would like to thank everyone for taking the time to fill those shoeboxes and bringing happiness to all the kids, not only in Cambodia, but all over the world.)

Although interacting with all these kids was difficult due to the language barrier, our facial expressions and hand gestures were enough for us to share the laughter and delight with these beautiful children.

Highlights in our travels included; listening to inspirational testimonies regarding the power of persevering in prayer which God was using to change difficult or impossible situations; having devotions with the team of Samaritan's Purse; trying strange foods like fried spiders, frogs, snake and grubs. From ploughing the ground, feeding the chickens and enduring the bumpy road trips, I can never fully express the fun and joy we all experienced as a team in blessing others and each other.

A special thanks to staff and parents who contributed to this journey by praying or packing a shoebox. Last but not least, thanks to God, who gave us safety throughout the journey, and the opportunity for us to see the Holy Spirit working in us and through the lives of the Cambodian people we met."

DANICA'S BIG DATA CHALLENGE

MONASH University



"On the 22nd of February I was one of three students who had the privilege of attending Monash University's Big Data Challenge. This day

consisted of approximately 80 students from schools all across Victoria that participated in one of four challenges - Actuarial Science Challenge, Business Analytics Challenge, Applied Mathematics Challenge and the Data Analysis Challenge. I chose the Actuarial Science Challenge as this was an area of study that had peaked my interest, and I thought that this challenge would be excellent exposure to what a career in this area would involve. In this challenge we were asked to create a mathematical model to demonstrate how much a person, who would be 15 in the year of 2050, should save throughout their lifetime to ensure that they had sufficient retirement funds. After the challenge, we were lucky enough to be able to listen to current students and industry professionals about their related fields and where maths at university can take you. Overall, this day was incredibly interesting, and was an amazing opportunity to see where maths can take you in the future."

Congratulations to the class of 2018 and their results!

It is with great pleasure that St Andrews Christian College celebrates the outstanding academic results achieved by the class of 2018. Once again the school has had the largest number of students graduate in its history as well as the largest number of subject offerings made available to the 2018 students.

The top performing student, and Dux of the College for 2018, is Caleb Wu, who achieved an ATAR of 98.95! - an incredible accomplishment and one he can be proud of.



Caleb completed his entire schooling at St Andrews from Prep., all the way through to Year 12. One of the highlights was seeing how Caleb was able to reflect on the ways

in which he was taught, and grew over the years, in areas that extended far beyond his academic studies.

Forty percent of our St Andrews students achieved ATARs above 80 with many being offered places at a range of universities that include: The University of Melbourne, Monash University, RMIT, Deakin, Latrobe and Swinburne in diverse disciplines such as Biomedicine and Fine Arts to Exercise and Sport Science and Business.

All staff at St Andrews are delighted to see our students successfully move on from the College

ST ANDREWS TEAMS WIN 2018 GLOBAL ECO CHALLENGE PRIZE







On three days in September, towards the end of Term 3, 28 Year 7 and 8 students from St Andrews took on the 2018 Eco Challenge in teams of two. The Challenge annually provides an exciting and authentic learning experience for students through the online strategic game, Aqua Republica, to explore issues and solutions relating to water management and sustainable development. Over 600 teams played around the world and the age range of competitors stretched from as young as Year 5 to tertiary-aged students.

This year, AUSTRALIA had the largest number of participants out of the 45 countries involved.

Australia had 4 teams in the Top 10, and all four these teams were from St Andrews Christian College! Joshua O'Donnell and Leon Hiew, two Year 7 students, were the overall Australian winners, and also placed second in the global competition. In second place were Cyrus Ting and Matthew Baker (Year 7) and in third place Noah Low and Kevin Wang (also from Year 7). According to the organisers, the St Andrews teams in general ranked very highly across both the national and international events. What an amazing achievement for our students!

Joshua O'Donnell deserves special mention, as he played the winning game! Both Joshua O'Donnell and Leon Hiew, his teammate, received a certificate and \$250.00 Coles/Myer gift card for first place in Australia from Curtin University in WA, as well as a \$150 Amazon gift card for achieving second place in Australia. They also each received certificates from the international organisers for first place in Australia and second place internationally.

Cyrus Ting and his teammate Matthew Baker, each received a certificate and a Coles/Myer gift card to the value of \$150 for achieving second place in Australia, and also a certificate each from the international organisers, honouring this achievement. Noah Low and his teammate Kevin Wang, received a certificate and a \$100 Coles/Myer gift card each for achieving third place in Australia, as well as a certificate from the international organisers, honouring their achievement. Congratulations to these students for taking on the challenge and being devoted to growth!
