Clean Up Australia is a not-forprofit environmental conservation organisation founded by Ian Kiernan in 1989. It has evolved to become the largest community-based environmental event in the country and is held annually on the first weekend of March. The success of the event has relied on a unique and simple idea – that individual Australians can make a difference and contribute to improving the Australian environment by working together as a community.

'Our mission is to inspire and empower communities, businesses and youth to clean up, fix up and conserve our environment.'



On the 3rd of March, St Andrews 10Y class joined hundreds of thousands of volunteers and participated in the 'Clean Up Australia Day'. Students cleaned the school grounds, Tyner Rd and Food Star carpark. They did an awesome job and collected more than 10 big bags of rubbish.

The most significant change was a great sense of community among the students. They were inspired, empowered and realised their environmental responsibility, the importance of community participation and that everyone can make a difference. 10Y is registered with 'Clean Up Australia' and all students will be awarded Volunteer certificates.

# How did Clean Up Australia start?

It is hard to believe that this campaign began as the inspiration of one man, Australian builder and solo yachtsman, Ian Kiernan.

lan Kiernan was a builder for 35 years before he sailed around the world and became concerned at the amount of rubbish clogging up the world's oceans.

On his return, in 1989, lan organised a community event to clean up Sydney Harbour. The event received an enormous public response with more than 40,000 Sydneysiders donating their time and energy to clean up the harbour.

The 1990 Clean Up Australia Day event was launched by the then Prime Minister, Bob Hawke and 300,000 volunteers took part and that involvement has steadily increased ever since.

After gaining the support of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), Clean Up the World was launched in 1993.



The appeal of Clean Up the World (more than 35 million people from 120 countries annually take part) has demonstrated that this simple Australian idea has universal appeal and the health of the environment is of concern to people and communities worldwide. Clean Up the World demonstrates that people across the planet are willing to do something to help protect and care for their environment. Since 1992, school communities across Australia have demonstrated their support for caring for the environment through participating in Schools and Clean Up Day.

# Cambodia Discovery Trip

# 2016 Cambodia Discovery Trip Report

Imagine not knowing where your next meal will come from and being so hungry that you will do almost anything for food. Or imagine being trapped in a never-ending cycle of debt so that you have to leave your family for 2 or 3 years and work as an illegal immigrant, vulnerable to exploitation, just to service the debt. One of the best aspects of our trip to Cambodia was seeing God's love in action in preventing these situations through the work of Samaritan's Purse.



Our first mission Discovery Trip to Cambodia with Samaritan's Purse safely returned just before Christmas. We were special guests at the opening of a Community Birthing Centre and were able to visit 10 projects that help rural Cambodians improve their lives such as, Maternal Infant and Child Health (MIACH), Food For Life (FFL) and Village Savings Groups. We saw some educational projects, ran games and activities at schools and participated in the distribution of Christmas in a Shoe Box gifts at a church and a school. We met many wonderful Cambodian Christians who work on these projects, sharing the love of Christ and expanding His

kingdom as they help these communities in practical ways.



We were able to help build some water filters and we ran activities for the grade ones and twos at one of the schools we visited. St Andrews Christian College will be

continuing to raise money for a school at Prasat Rang throughout this year.



Thank you to those who prayed for us and particularly to the PFA who donated money which we used to buy the parachute and sports equipment. This was then donated to the school we visited.


## Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge
