#### Dear Friends,

#### Are you prepared for Christmas?

In the busyness of the month, most people are probably not prepared in the way of decorations, shopping, wrapping presents, preparing menus, organising holiday arrangements/packing, etc.

But, I wonder if we are prepared spiritually and have the right attitude in the build up to Christmas?

My church pastor gave a wonderful message this week on the important attitudes (displayed by Joseph) we need in preparing for Christmas (Matthew 1:18-25).

#### 1. Accept God's Way

In the Christmas story we don't hear much about Joseph, but he played an integral part and teaches us all how to live through simple faith, obedience and trust. Imagine being in his position. He was pledged to be married to Mary, but as far as he knew Mary had been unfaithful to him and broke a strong bond that existed between them.

According to law, Mary should have been stoned to death, but Joseph didn't want that so he quietly planned to divorce her.

Matthew 1:20-21 then explains what happened next: But after he considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save people from their sins."

Joseph teaches us to accept God's way – whatever that may be. Joseph didn't know all the details but he was a man of genuine faith, who trusted God, was obedient and faithful in fulfilling God's plan in God's way.

Christmas happened in the way it did, because Joseph trusted God!

#### 2. Look Out For Others

Joseph didn't have a starring role in the nativity, but his role was very important. He had been assigned to take care of Mary and baby Jesus.

#### 3. A Time to Give

Christmas happened, because Joseph put his own concerns aside and was prepared to give. He didn't know that after Jesus was born he would have to flee and take Jesus and the family to Egypt, away from his home and support. God had a plan and Joseph followed it faithfully.

As we come into the Christmas season, may we come close to God and accept His way in our lives.



# **CHRISTMAS - GOD'S MESSAGE OF LOVE**



Everything we know about the original Christmas (you know – the one about Jesus being born) comes from the Bible.

I wonder which Christmas story is most familiar to you. Is it God announcing to Mary that she would be the mother of Jesus? Is it the angel's announcement to the shepherds of the birth of Jesus? Or perhaps it's the journey of the wise men to find him.

In the final assembly, our Christmas Assembly, held at our college on the last day of the year, I chose not to speak to the students about any of these familiar Christmas stories, wonderful though they are! Instead, I retold one of Jesus' parables – the Parable of the Lost Sheep. It is found in Luke 15:1 – 7. You may be familiar with it. It is the one where the shepherd who has one hundred sheep loses one and leaves the ninety-nine to search for it. He is full of joy when he finds his lost sheep and he invites his neighbours and friends to rejoice with him. Jesus concludes in verse 7; *"I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent".* 

The shepherd in the parable represents God. It is wonderful to see then that God searches for people – just as the shepherd searched for his lost sheep. Jesus is saying that God feels similar overwhelming joy when someone comes back to him and is "found" by him.

You see, without a relationship with God, found only through Jesus Christ, God regards us as lost. This is not what I think – this is what God tells us in the Bible. And here's the thing – God is searching for us. Not because he wants to punish us, but because he longs for us to

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come back to him. He wants us to enjoy the Eternal Life, love and forgiveness that he wants to pour on us.

So could it be that God is lovingly pursuing you? Is God searching for you and beckoning you to enjoy his love even more? Perhaps he's doing that through the people you love, or through nature or even through difficult times.

If God, as Jesus describes, cares about us like a good shepherd cares about his sheep, that is a wonderful truth. Christmas and the recollection of Jesus' birth is God's obvious expression of seeking out people – of God pursuing us with a wonderful invitation to once again be caught up in his love and embrace. No wonder the angel in the Bible's Christmas story said that he had Good News for all the people! He also said, "Don't be afraid."

Ultimately, God sent Jesus to take the punishment for our sins on the cross and to rise again to Life. Christmas is God taking on human flesh, being born as a vulnerable little baby, who grew up to become Jesus the Saviour, and pursuing humanity – including you & me. He died on a cross for our forgiveness and rose again and is inviting us to enjoy his love forever.

Augustine was a church leader in North Africa in the 4th & 5th century and he said, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."

Over the holidays, as we have a bit more time than we normally do during the term, I hope you have time to consider if God is gently pursuing you in the same way that the shepherd in Jesus' parable sought out his sheep, and inviting you not to simply acknowledge him from a distance, but inviting you to really engage with him and to immerse yourself in his love - forever. And it can be FOREVER.

But like all invitations, you have to accept it! Why continue to be lost when you can allow God to "find" you? Fall into his loving arms this Christmas. There just isn't a better Christmas present!

# MONASH UNIVERSITY STUDENT EXPERIENCE

Visiting a university campus is an



important step in deciding where students would continue their education after high school and also an opportunity to get a feel for the university culture.

St Andrews Senior School students visited Monash University twice this year; in Term 2 -Monash Clayton Campus guided tour and faculty presentations for Year 11 and 12 students and in Term 4 - Monash Peninsula Student Experience Day for Year 10 and 11 students.

The Monash University Peninsula Campus Student Experience Day was included in our Senior School Headstart Program and offered a range of insightful and interactive activities:

- a session from a leading educational psychologist on managing stress, building resilience and staying motivated in the VCE
- faculty workshops: Education 'The future of digital learning', Business 'What will our future leaders 'look' like?' and Medicine, Nursing and Health Sciences – 'The

'Mask Ed' program where students checked vital signs, performed CPR and gave simulated injections and a tour of Monash paramedic facilities

- a presentation about Monash University courses, scholarships, entry schemes and student life
- Monash Peninsula Campus guided tour.

On Thursday 28th November, our Year 10s and 11 students went on a day long excursion to Monash University in Frankston. This was a great opportunity to see what is offered at University. When we arrived we went to the gym and completed some challenging puzzles. Next we heard an interesting and engaging talk from a psychologist about stress in young people. After this we split up into three elective groups: medicine, business and teaching, to explore what these areas could become in the future. Finally we had a person from the University to answer all of our burning career questions. *"The day was an exciting experience of university!"* - Callum Andrew Year 10 student.

As the end of the school year is approaching, I take time to review and reflect on the many activities and programs we have offered to our students in 2019 and plan for a new year.

#### YEAR 10 WORK EXPERIENCE

Traditionally it is a very exciting time in Year 10 study, during which students meet new people, explore possible careers options and develop work readiness skills. A placement with an employer is designed to provide an insight into an industry and the world of work. Plus, this is a great way for students to build their resume and start a list of future referees. St Andrews work experience takes place during the last week of Term 2. The dates for 2020 are Saturday 20th - Friday 26th June.

#### **ENGAGE & EMPOWER YEAR 10 CAREERS PROGRAM**

The goal of the program is to encourage students to be passionate about their future. In partnership with Commonwealth Bank's award-winning 'Start Smart' financial literacy educational program. Students are offered an insight on how to be smart in earning, saving, spending, investing and enterprise. 'Resume writing' and 'Interview skills' workshops are led by Box Hill Institute Skills & Jobs Centre, and ATO presenters teach our students about tax and super. A morning VicRoads theory session 'Road Smart' and an afternoon practical component at METEC help prepare our beginner drivers for a lifetime of safe driving. Students also complete an online career diagnostic quiz and create their career action plan. In 2020 the Engage and Empower Year 10 Careers Program will run from Wednesday 18th -Friday 20th March.

#### **BARISTA COURSE**

In 2020 we are partnering with William Angliss Institute to offer our Year 10 students an opportunity to learn valuable skills in hospitality and coffee making held on Wednesday 10th June.

It is an honour and privilege to be a part of our students' career exploration journey and support them as they anticipate their tomorrows and move towards the future of work or further study. All of the activities we offer enable students to learn more about themselves and their interests, aptitudes, values and strengths and get inspired about their future study.
