New Child Safe Standards

In 2013, the Victorian Parliament held an Inquiry into the Handling of Child Abuse by Religious and Other Non-Government Organisations, resulting in the Betrayal of Trust Report.

The report found that more could be done to strengthen existing approaches to child safety. In response, the Victorian Government is phasing in child safe standards for organisations that work with children, including schools.

Our response as a College is not just to meet the new required standards and laws, but to surpass the benchmarks set by the State Government and Educational authorities.

St Andrews Christian College is committed to provide a safe environment for all our students.

The College is committed to promoting and protecting the safety and best interests of children, actively working to empower them, and allowing them to feel and be safe at all times.

Child Abuse is any action (or non-action) that hurts a child or puts a child in danger.

Child abuse of any kind is never acceptable. St Andrews Christian College has zero tolerance for child abuse.

With changes in the law, we have been reviewing and strengthening all our Child Protection policies.

It has resulted in a new <u>Child Safety Policy</u> which also includes Mandatory Reporting. To support these documents the College has also actioned a <u>Strategic Review and Plan</u> of how we are strengthening our Child Safety at St Andrews. You can read these new documents on the College website (under Policies -<u>http://standrews.vic.edu.au/about/policies/</u>) or ask for a hard copy from Mrs Dekker at the Front Office.

What does all this mean for our College Community?

- Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- Child Safety will be embedded into all of the College culture.
- A new 'Code of Conduct' will be mandatory for volunteers/contractors/visiting specialist/extra-curricular teachers.
- Clear boundaries for all adults in our College community in how they interact with children here.
- The Child Safe standards apply to College Staff (including volunteers and contractors), visitors and students' family members.

We learnt more about the new Child Safe Standards and what parents need to do to help keep their child safe at this week's PFA meeting.

Vanuatu Mission Trip

St Andrews Mission Awareness Trip 2016

St Andrews Christian College have just returned from our fourth trip to Tata School. It all started in 2012 when Mrs Wansbrough visited Vanuatu and met with the Educational Director and selected Tata for an initial visit. Since then we have had four visits with students, parents and staff all playing their part. This year Mrs Wade and I took seven students from Years 9 and 11, three alumni and a teacher to be an encouragement to the staff and students of Tata School.



The theme for the trip was "Showing Compassion & Kindness" and we based our teaching, songs and activities around Ephesians 4:32, *"Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other just as Christ Jesus has done for us."*

The students from St Andrews were Olivia Rowland, Chloe Chandraraj, Audrey Ang, Ann Xia, Jerry Cheng, Isaac Cheng and Joel Julian. The teacher was Mrs Sires, and the alumni were Elise, Jess and Sophie Wade. The St Andrews students were wonderful with the way they interacted with all the students of Tata. They ran around, played games, shared stories, did amazing craft activities and had so much love for all the primary students. They also shared and built high levels of trust and friendship with the secondary students. We had terrific fun teaching them games, playing soccer and volleyball, singing choruses together and generally developing our friendships.

We all felt God surrounding us with His peace and protection, and we could see His hand at work in so many situations. The trip was an amazing time and in so many ways the team had to rely upon God. We learnt so much from the people in Vanuatu.

Elise Wade: God has taught me how He uses us for His glory. Our baptism was so amazing, but even more special was how He used it to teach the Vanuatu people more about Him and bring the bond with St Andrews and them closer.



Sonia Sires: God has taught me to rely on Him – like when I had to teach a Year 8 class about essay writing. He's also taught me to rest in Him and to be still and know that He's in control. He taught me to relax and enjoy "island time" rather than worry about doing things at a fast pace like in Australia.

Isaac Cheng: Upon reflection, my favourite part of this trip was going to Tata school and helping teach the younger classes. Seeing their happiness was amazing. God taught me money and monetary value can't bring true happiness.

Ann Xia: God has taught me that even though the people in Vanuatu were not as wealthy as us, their heart to serve God is still the same. Joel Julien: Meeting the students at Tata school was one of my favourite parts. It was great to build relationships with the boys and learn about their culture. My buddy was amazing and educated me on how life was. God has taught me to have faith in Him when things do not go to plan.

Chloe Chandraraj: My favourite parts were teaching the children, building relationships with not only the secondary kids, primary kids and our buddies, but also our team. I especially loved teaching the primary students and doing the Tabloid sports day with the secondary and primary classes. Some lessons I learnt on this trip were to be flexible when put in awkward situations and to rely on God.




Jess Wade: My favourite parts of the trip were teaching Class One and singing with

them, and getting baptised with the amazing Pastor Yosef.

Olivia Rowland: My favourite part of the trip was chatting with the girls on the sleepover and really connecting with them over the little things - one girl wrote me a beautiful letter and it really showed how profound an impact a simple conversation can have on someone. God taught me to rely and trust on Him. Despite all our planning and preparing things some things still didn't go to plan. I learnt that we need to trust that God has His own plan and that His plan is much better than ours.

Sophie Wade: A favourite experience was having extra nights at Tata when the team went back to the resort. And then having the Pastor ask me to share in their high school assembly. God taught me that when I am lacking, God will provide eg. I lacked energy and He gave me times of rest, I lacked time to prepare and feel confident in making the devotions, and He led me through the preparation and gave me confidence in sharing it.



Jerry Cheng: My favourite part of the trip were the baptisms of Elise and Jess on Tangoa Island. I was also very touched by the beautiful singing of the children at Tata school – what amazing worship! Vanuatu's motto is 'Long God yumi stanap' which means 'In God we stand'. For myself, I highly respect and value a strong relationship with Jesus by faith, hope and love. God has taught me to be confident in my faith. Audrey Ang: I loved building relationships with not only the team, but everyone we met especially our buddies. God taught me that serving Him in a different environment can make an impact on different people. He also taught me that I have a purpose to share the word of God.

Sally Wade: There were so many firsts on this trip like an earthquake, a new lunch location on our sightseeing day and a new Primary Principal at Tata. But the most amazing event for me was seeing our daughters being baptised and seeing how this act has strengthened our relationship with the community at Tata. The Pastor and Principal were most excited about this history making event, being the first adult baptisms on the Island. God's glory was evident throughout the day.

She also won a BRONZE MEDAL in a very strong event of 16 skaters around the country.






Senior School



School Banking tokens and rewards

Recently some parents have expressed concerns about Dollarmite tokens and how rewards are distributed to student bankers.

Each deposit made through the school entitles the banker to

one silver token. Students must bank 10 times through the school in order to redeem a reward. Students can do that by submitting the reward coupon together with their 10 Dollarmite silver tokens (or 1 Dollarmite Gold token) on banking day. Reward items ordered normally arrive at school within 1-2 weeks and will be distributed back to the student from their classroom.

School banking takes place at St Andrews each Tuesday morning. The money is collected and processed by a small team of volunteer mums who give their time generously. While every effort is made to ensure that tokens are placed in each student banker's wallet, on rare occasions some tokens may be missed. This could be overcome with more volunteers, so parents please email us if you can help.

The midyear additions to the VPRC list is now available. Students in Years 7 and 8 have some new titles to read. These include:




