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Principal

Dear Parents and Friends of St Andrews Christian College,

Our school and other Christian schools in Victoria face a very serious threat to our freedom to operate as a Christian school.

The Andrews Government has introduced a Bill into Parliament to amendment the Equal Opportunity Act 2010. The proposed amendments are directly targeted at Christian and other faith-based schools. They would have the impact of removing our right to employ Christian staff without the threat of Government intervention in the process. The changes, outlined in more detail in the attached Fact Sheet, go well beyond what is fair and reasonable and ignore the recommendations of the extensive Parliamentary review of the legislation undertaken by the Labor Government when last in office. Promoted as being about balance they will make religious belief, and the right to live out those beliefs, very much subservient to the rights of others who do not share those beliefs. Over time the effect of the Government's legislation could be the increasing secularisation of Christian and other faith-based schools.

We understand that the Government's Bill will be voted on in the Lower House within the next fortnight. As a parent of a student attending a Christian school your voice needs to be heard by the Government in relation to this issue and your choice to send your children to a Christian school.

I encourage you to write to local MPs before the end of this term to object to this attack on our freedom to operate as a Christian school.

Key Messages

- The Bill is a clear attack on faith based schools and other religious bodies.
- Current exemptions provide a necessary protection of religious freedom and a fair balance between 'competing' rights.
- The changes proposed by the ALP are inconsistent with the recommendations of

its own extensive Review undertaken when last in Government.

 Current legislation is consistent with legislation of the Commonwealth and other States/Territories and amendments would create conflicts and confusion.


For Your Information:




Year 10 at Deakin University




Alice Miranda by Jacqueline Harvey.
