# GRADUATE PROFILE

Our goal is the formation of students who display the following attributes:



The Graduate Profile identifies the key characteristics being developed in students who attend St Andrews Christian College. These characteristics are nurtured and developed throughout a student's schooling journey at St Andrews as they are taught to understand life on the basis of Biblical truth. It is our prayer that our graduating students are motivated and equipped to serve their communities as they leave the College and transition into the next stage of their lives.

At St Andrews, we endeavour to nurture our students by anticipating the challenges of this transitional year at a wellbeing level, using different programs to address the main issues confronting Year 7 students. Our aim is to help our students to be responsible, well-skilled, enthusiastic and self-motivated learners. A significant number of our Year 7 subject teachers also teach at VCE level, and have a clear vision of the expectations that later year levels will place upon students.

Each student will participate in a wide range of subjects that will stimulate and challenge them. These subjects cover all areas of the Australian Curriculum and begin a student's pathway to taking greater responsibility for their learning. We also provide a specialist subject program to enable students to gain further experience in Drama, Music, STEM and Visual Arts.

Recognising the benefits of a grounded understanding in Literacy and Numeracy, the two homerooms are divided into three homogenous classes for English and Mathematics. This allows teachers to have a greater knowledge of students as learners—providing more effective and regular feedback to improve learning.

We have a dedicated Pastoral Care time in which the Queensland University of Technology's Resourceful Adolescent Program (RAP) is used to help students develop their resilience and self-care; preparing them for the challenges of Secondary School. We also run programs such as Youth Mental Health First Aid to help address issues surrounding mental health and respectful relationships.

The Year 7 camp is a highlight for students and teachers alike. Our Coolamatong camp takes place early in the year to create an opportunity for Year 7 students to engage in team building activities and develop new relationships as they begin Secondary School.

The partnership between home and school is a critical factor in the transition from Primary School. It is in the interest of our students to know their parents and teachers are working together. To keep this partnership healthy, communication is vital and we look forward to partnering with you as your child continues their educational journey through Secondary School.

In Year 8, students continue to develop their independent learning skills, and take greater ownership of their learning. This is achieved through our core curriculum and is well-supported by an elective program where students can choose to explore areas of study that interest them. The elective program is designed to allow students to pursue those disciplines throughout the Secondary School.

Year 8 students often grapple with life's big questions such as, "Who am I?' 'Where do I belong?' and 'What is the point of all of this?'. Our curriculum and approach to supporting students from a Biblical worldview helps students to explore these questions.

Students choose two electives each Semester allowing them to pursue their passions and explore more of the academic program on offer. Students are encouraged to try new subjects and learn in new and different ways. This will help provide them a wider understanding of possibilities moving forward in their Secondary schooling.

In Pastoral Care, students complete Queensland University of Technology's Resourceful Adolescent Program (RAP) and further enhance their understanding in how to deal with challenges presented to them. These weekly times, led by their Homeroom teacher, allow students to focus on developing their social, emotional and personal learning.

The Year 8 camp at Kangaroobie, near the Great Ocean Road, enables students to experience a working farm environment while also participating in a range of adventure activities designed to enhance team-work and develop resilience. Presenting new and stretching experiences helps students to shape their worldview, and explore their capabilities.

In Year 9, there is an emphasis on achieving a balance between students learning subject content and developing the necessary attributes to become lifelong learners. Students are encouraged to think about how they learn best, to set personal learning goals and to build a range of strategies for completing and evaluating their work.

Choosing electives to study enables students to explore areas of study that interest them and creates a greater sense of control over their own learning. The Year 9 Elective program further expands to include new choices and options from the previous year.

All Year 9 students are enrolled and supported to complete the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award. This internationally recognised Award encourages students to learn new skills, be physically active and participate in community service. Our Year 9 students are guided and supervised by Homeroom teachers to enable them to complete this award.

Students will complete the Morrisby Career Profiling Assessment which helps them to explore career opportunities based upon their interests and abilities. The Morrisby Profile also gives students options of potential subjects to pursue in order to help achieve their post-schooling career goals. A Course-Counselling Interview with students and families helps provide further guidance regarding the nature of VCE and what the next few years of Secondary School could be for their academic program.


A highlight for Year 9 students is the camp to Central Australia. Also completed in conjunction with the Duke of Edinburgh Award, students travel by bus from St Andrews up to Darwin across two weeks. Our students experience parts of Australia many have never experienced and learn skills such as how to set up and use tents, in addition to the teamwork required to complete the long trek.

Year 10 builds upon the independence and strengths developed throughout Year 9. Students continue to engage in a broad education and begin to plan their Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) program of study. In Year 10, students grapple with the direction of their future schooling, including what courses and career options are available to them.

Students complete a core program of English, Mathematics, Science, History and Physical Education and supplement this with a range of elective subjects; designed to prepare them with the necessary skills and knowledge to move seamlessly into VCE studies. Students will choose up to four electives through the course of the year to provide a depth and breadth of education opportunities. Each of these elective subjects has the same class time as a Core subject in order to promote depth of learning as preparation for VCE.

Career pathway planning is supported in Year 10. Students are provided with support if they choose to complete Work Experience and participate in Careers workshops throughout the year. The Morrisby Career Profiling Assessment tool is continued to be used to help students and families work through the aptitudes and skills students indicate. We work in partnership with families to tailor the best pathway and program for students as they progress through to the completion of Secondary education.

Many Year 10 students begin their VCE journey through the Accelerated Subject program. This selective program allows students to choose from a range of VCE subjects, across faculties, to initiate their VCE studies. Students gain valuable skills in how to approach a VCE subject, placing them well on the pathway towards futher academic growth.

The necessary study habits to do well in VCE are practiced throughout Year 11 to enable them to be set in place before embarking upon Year 12. Throughout the year, students are given opportunities to learn study skills which will be invaluable for any future education they may choose.

In Years 11 students are placed in Homerooms which are split amongst Year 11 and 12 students. This multiage approach to Pastoral Care allows for a depth of connection and community that will sustain students through a challenging period in their schooling.

Year 12 is the culmination of a student's Secondary School educational journey. It is often through difficult and challenging times that students can experience great times of growth. We endeavour to walk the journey of preparing for Examinations and assessments with Year 12 students; providing support and encouragement throughout the year.

Students participate in community activities such as a School Formal, House events and Sports Rally Days in addition to the annual Study Camp. Camp for Year 12 students is an excellent way to expand friendships and develop shared memories to last well beyond life at St Andrews.

One-to-one Careers advice is provided for each Year 12 student, in order to provide guidance about course requirements, pre-requisites, and how to apply for Tertiary courses. Students find these times to be a source of encouragement and give clarity to navigating the next step beyond school.
